WHAT is SETA's Refugee Program?

SETA, through contracts with local agencies, provides direct services intended to result in the economic self-sufficiency and reduced welfare dependency of refugees through employment.

WHO is eligible for Refugee Services?

Refugees and asylees who meet the following criteria are eligible for services:

- * Sacramento County residents who have been in the United States for less than five (5) years
- * 16 years of age or older; and
- * Not a full-time student in primary or secondary school (unless the refugee is a mandatory client referred by the County)

AND meet one of the following criteria:

Generally, a Refugee is a person outside of his or her country of nationality who is unable or unwilling to return because of persecution, or a well-founded fear of persecution, on account of race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion.

The majority of Refugee clients served in Sacramento County are from the former Soviet Union (79%), Southeast Asia (15%), and the Middle East (3%).
