3. Review of May 25, 2011 Board Packet

Ms. Ferrari reported that EDD's deputy director is thanking the career centers for cooperation. The proclamation will be presented to Ms. Welsch, Mr. Walker, Ms. Purdy, and Ms. Kossick on behalf of all of the career centers.

Ms. Purdy stated that she will provide a list of the five things that are important at the regional level. This will be presented separately.

Ms. Welsch reviewed the funding recommendations for the youth program.

The Policy Matters information item provides information on how the Workforce Investment Act operates. It is an item for future discussion.

Ms. Kossick reported that there are three upcoming vacancies: Bill Karns, Mike Micciche, and Matt Mahood. Staff will be working to secure applicants to fill these vacancies

Mr. Camp spoke about ways to urge our elected officials to support reauthorization of the WIA. The WIB members cannot lobby. It's helpful in terms of reauthorization that this program provides training. Mr. Camp wants to find a way to have the appointing authority to lobby on our behalf.

Ms. Ferrari stated that because there is not a branded workforce delivery system, the politicos do not even know we exist.

Mr. Cunningham reminded the committee that the Workforce Investment Board cannot take a stand regarding WIA, but members can educate. Members can point out how well the regional collaboration works in the Sacramento area. The WIB can ask the Governing Board to take a position but they cannot tell the Governing Board the position to take.

Ms. Purdy stated that the Workforce Investment Act requires a career center system. In Sacramento County there are leveraged partners. SETA very much values our partners.

Ms. Purdy stated that there will be an upcoming need to deal with reduced federal funding; she said that the Sacramento WIB does a great job of training with the federal funds allocated.

APPROVAL OF REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR SACRAMENTO WORKS, INC. BOARD INITIATIVE FUNDS

BACKGROUND:

In March, 2011, the Executive Committee discussed the process that should be used to allocate the Sacramento Works, Inc. Board Initiative funds. The Executive Committee members stated that they would like to develop a Request for Proposals process, specify certain times of the year (May and November) to take requests for funding, and set priorities (outreach, research and innovation) for the funds to ensure consistency with the goals of Sacramento Works, Inc.

The total amount allocated for Board Initiatives is \$151,430 and staff has identified \$22,650 in unspent funds from last year, resulting in a total of \$174,080 for Board Initiatives for FY 2011-2012. Historically the board has approved 69% of the funds (\$120,116) for Employer Outreach activities. This would leave \$53,964 for other board initiatives.

A draft Request for Proposals for the Sacramento Works Board Initiative funds will be sent under separate cover.

RECOMMENDATION:

- 1. Review the priorities of Sacramento Works.
- 2. Recommend to full board approval of the Request for Proposals for Sacramento Works Board Initiatives funds to be used for workforce research, employer outreach, or business retention and expansion and identify the available amount in each area.
