

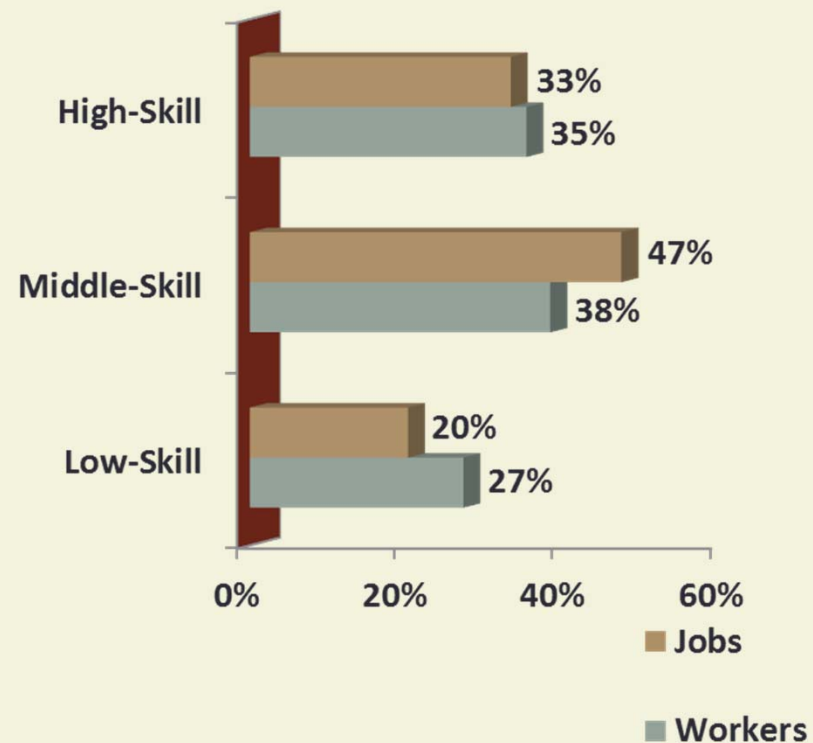

WIA Public Input

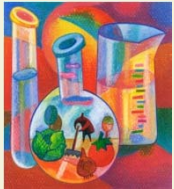


- **Public input from community stakeholders placed priority on increasing:**

 - **Resources allocated to training in occupational clusters with high demand/growth potential**

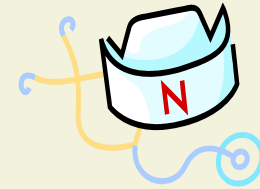
Sacramento Works Strategic Goals

- Construction/Clean Energy Technology

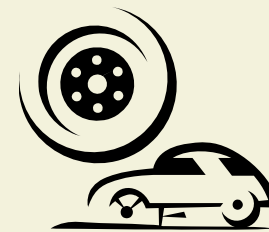

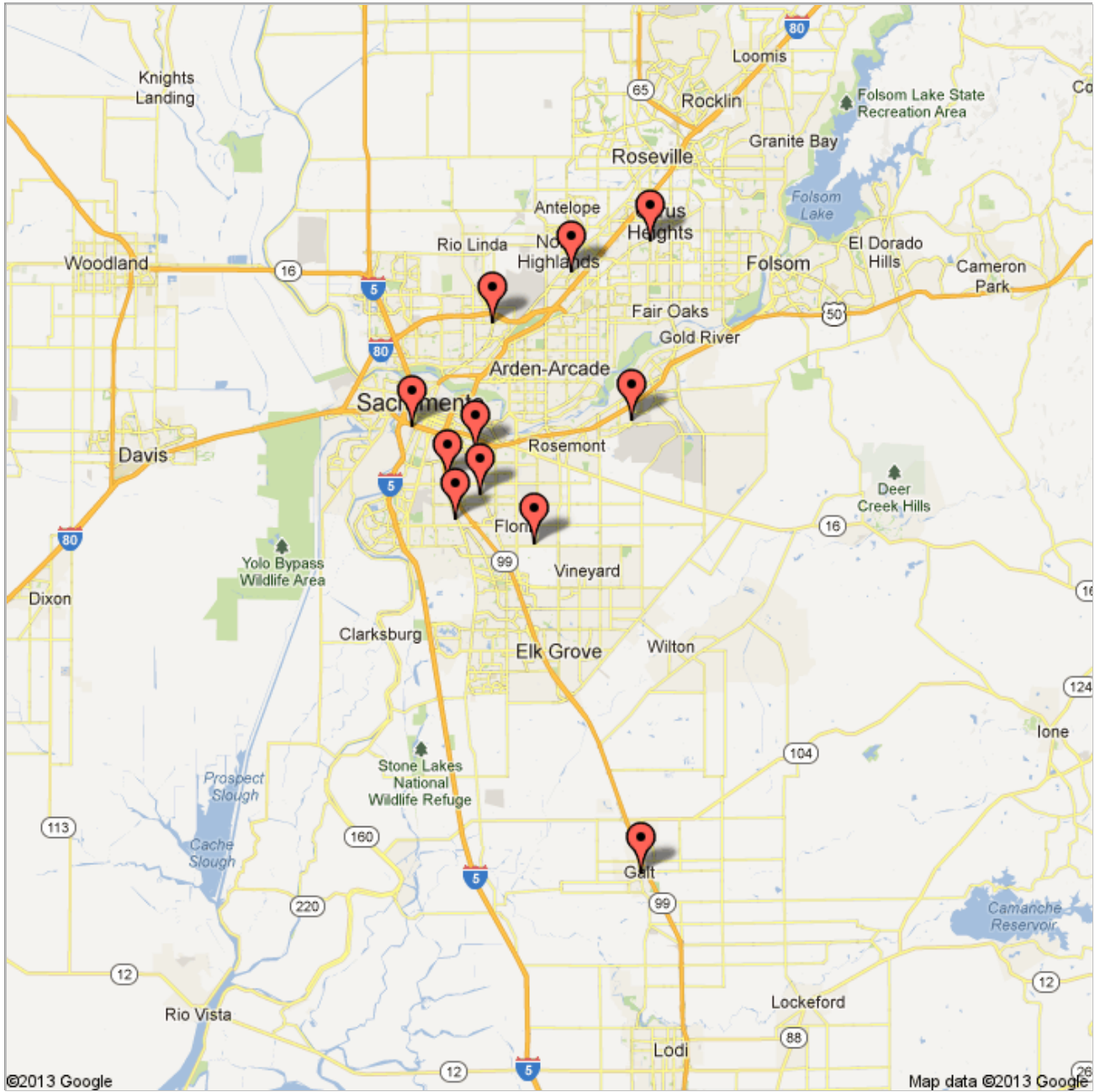


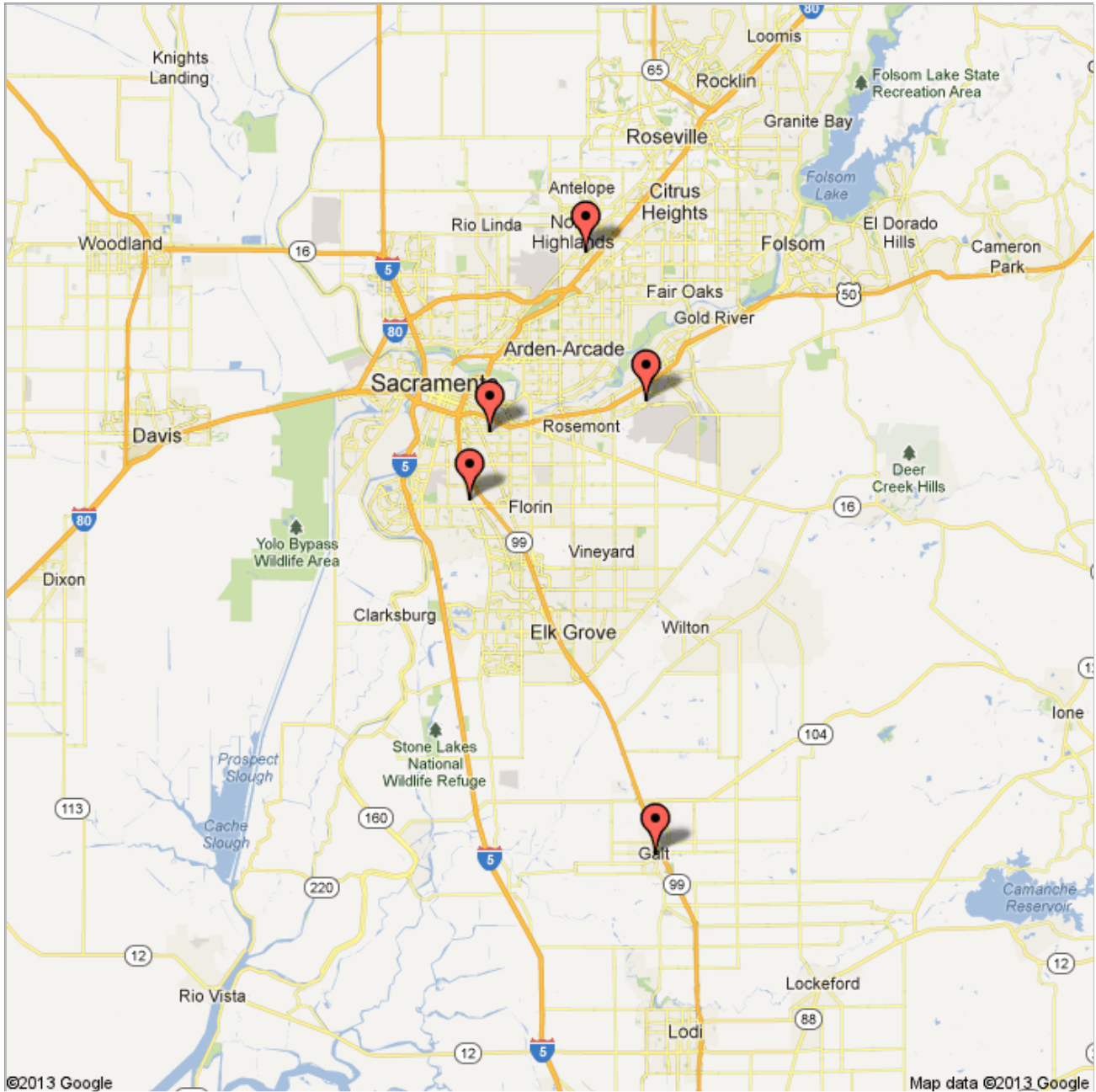
- **Work Preparedness Training , including**
