


HEAD START COORDINATOR (EDUCATION) (SUPERVISORY)

Position Summary: Under general direction, the Head Start Coordinator (Education) (Supervisory) oversees, manages, organizes and monitors the proper delivery of educational services to the Head Start and Early Head Start (EHS) education programs and options; prepares and updates policies and procedures; monitors and ensures compliance with local, state, and federal regulations and standards, and Head Start/EHS service area plans; develops and implements required training and education to Head Start/EHS staff; represents Head Start and EHS education programs in interactions with other SETA departments and staff, governmental and private agencies, consultants, parents, and other outside organizations; and performs related duties as

Start Performance Standards are met.

- Provide leadership, direction, and supervision of comprehensive mental health and disabilities intervention services to content staff
- Ensure compliance with state and federal guidelines related to special education services in educational settings
- Maintains understanding of current issues and regulations in early childhood education related to mental health and disabilities, and has a working knowledge of IEP/IFSP and referral processes at local school districts
- Compiles data analysis for reporting and program improvement plans
- Plans and delivers professional development opportunities to direct staff and education team
- Conducts internal audits of data and documentation to make sure information and processes are accurate





- Works with Program Officers to ensure Intervention Specialist caseloads are managed, and services are happening at sites
- Contributes to annual Self-Assessment in content area
- Provides support to Delegate agencies on mental health and disabilities related needs

Starting Salary: \$30.08/Hr. to \$38.39/Hr. (New employees typically are hired at the first step. SETA's pay scale consists of six steps, each step increase is on an annual basis.)

Minimum Qualifications:

Any combination of training and experience which would likely provide the required knowledges and abilities is qualifying. A typical way to obtain these knowledges and abilities would be:

I. At least five (5) years of experience as an Early Childhood Head Teacher or Center Director preferable, including two years in the Head Start program, or two (2) years of successful supervisory experience in a similar program assisting the Early Childhood Development of young children;



Education:

- I. Bachelor's or advanced degree in Early Childhood Education;
- II. Possession of a Bachelor's or advanced degree in any field related to child development and possession of a Child Development Site Supervisor Permit or higher as verified by the State of California Commission on Teacher Credentialing.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS: Possession of, or ability to obtain, a valid Class C California Driver's License is required. A good driving record of at least three (3) years duration, as evidenced by freedom from multiple or serious traffic violations or accidents, is required.



WHO MAY and HOW TO APPLY: This is an Open Recruitment. Open to the public as well as current employees, and employees eligible for transfer or voluntary demotion. A completed SETA application or transfer form must be submitted by the deadline date using the online application which can be found at
